BSM School Uniform



BSM has a simple uniform, which changes slightly in style as pupils move through the school. Our uniform encourages a sense of belonging and pride in our students. All students from Nursery to Year 11 wear school uniform. Sixth form students must follow the Sixth Form dress code.

There is a uniform shop on the school site open during term time. Parents are invited to buy uniform from any retailer, not just the BSM shop. Items available from the Uniform Shop are marked with a " ‡ ". There is also a <u>Facebook Page</u> run by parents for buying and selling uniform.

- Footwear should be completely black with no heel, no open toe or open back.
- Any logo or sole should also be completely black.
- The footwear should be a shoe or trainer and not a boot.

Jewellery

Please see our jewellery guide here.

- Primary Jewellery permitted 1 watch, 1 pair of stud earrings
- **Senior** Jewellery permitted 1 watch, 1 necklace (small and discreet), 1 pair of stud earrings, 1 signet ring
- Facial piercings are not allowed
- Religious jewellery and adornments any family wishing a child to wear such items should submit a written request to the Pastoral Deputy Head of Primary School or Senior School, through the Primary or Senior School Office in advance of item being worn. This request will then be reviewed and a written response will be given to the family regarding the School's decision.
- **PE for Primary** if your child is unable to remove their own earrings from their ear lobe, then they must come to school with plasters over their earrings. We are unable to provide them from the Health Centre.
- PE for Senior all jewellery needs to be removed

Make Up

- Primary no make up to be worn
- **Senior** Make- up, if worn, should be subtle, minimalistic and natural.
- Nail varnish is not permitted

Hair

- Primary Hair must be tidy and long hair tied back at all times.
- **Senior** Hair must be tidy and long hair tied back for practical subjects such as PE, Science practical, DT and Art.
- Hair styles and colour should be smart, professional and not extreme. Hair styles and hair colour should not be a distraction to learning.
- All hair accessories should be modest and not distract from learning.
- Blue, black or white headscarves can be worn by girls.

Other

- Clearly label all belongings with your child's name, including hats and bags.
- If a skirt, skort or shorts is not knee length, then trousers should be worn. <u>See trouser</u> guide here.
- Leggings should not be worn beneath skirts, skorts or shorts trousers should be worn instead exception is when the child is doing PE.
- During any fancy dress days, clothes should be culturally appropriate. No hair dye or excessive make up on these days.
- Any student returning to BSM as a visitor, should also be wearing culturally appropriate clothing.

PE Uniform

PE kit is worn by students in FS2 to Y11.

- PE Shirt (house colour) ‡
- PE shorts with BSM logo ‡
- White sports socks
- Trainers with non-marking soles
- Sun hat, water bottle and sun cream
- Year 5 upwards will require shin pads for some lessons (Long socks should be worn with shin pads)

- Navy blue swimming shorts / swimming costume
- Waterproof swimming bag
- Swimming cap
- PE bag (‡) with towel and brush (towel can be any design normal or poncho style)
- Black leggings can be worn under shorts to cover the legs in PE only
- Plain navy blue jogging bottoms can be worn. These should not be figure hugging and should have no patterns, stripes or coloured logos on them

FS1 wear their usual uniform for PE

Sixth Form are not required to wear BSM PE kit but must wear suitable sports clothing and footwear.

New students should wear a plain coloured t-shirt for PE until they are allocated a house colour.

Sixth Form Dress Code

Boys	Girls

Ear studs, watch, bracelet, neck chain	Earrings, watch, bracelet neck chain. Earrings should be no bigger than 3cm in diameter
If hair is dyed, it should be a natural colour and not extreme in style	If hair is dyed, it should be a natural colour and not extreme in style. If make-up is worn, it should be subtle and natural-looking.
