

BSM School Uniform



BSM has a simple uniform, which changes slightly in style as students move through the school.

Our uniform encourages a sense of belonging and pride in our students. All students from Foundation Stage to Year 11 wear school uniform. Sixth form students must follow the Sixth Form dress code.

- Items in **BOLD must only be bought from ZAKS**, our school uniform supplier.
- Items available from ZAKS, our uniform supplier, are marked with a “ ‡ ”.

From August 2024 we will use ZAKS as our Uniform supplier.

Zaks will offer the opportunity to purchase and try on BSM uniforms in their shop 6 days a week until late (located close to Al Mouj) and online via their app.

The only changes to the uniform will be for Senior School boys in Years 7 - 11: From August 2024, Senior School boys in Years 7 - 11 will be able to wear navy shorts with their uniform and we will gradually replace the charcoal trousers with navy blue ones over the next few years. All other uniform items will remain as they are. These changes will begin from August 2024.

Sports Kit

PE Lessons

PE kit is worn by students in FS2 to Y11. (FS1 wear their usual uniform for PE lessons)

- **BSM PE shorts** ‡
- **BSM PE Shirt (house colour)** ‡
(New students should wear a plain t-shirt for PE until they are allocated a house colour)
- White sports socks ‡
- Trainers with non-marking soles
- PE bag ‡
- Sun hat (own choice) ‡
- Water bottle
- Shin Pads: Year 5 upwards will require shin pads for some PE lessons (Navy Long socks should be worn with shin pads)
- Black leggings can be worn under shorts to cover the legs - in PE only

Sixth Form students are not required to wear BSM PE kit but must wear suitable sports clothing and footwear.

Swimming

Swim kit is required for students in FS1 (summer term) upwards..

- Navy blue swimming shorts / suit / costume ‡
- Waterproof swimming bag ‡
- Swimming cap ‡
- Towel (any design - normal or poncho style)
- Hairbrush

Sixth Form Dress Code

Boys	Girls

What to wear to school

On a normal school day, students should wear their BSM school uniform to school.

On PE / Swimming days:

FS2 - Y3:

- **PE Days:** Children should come to school in their PE Kit. They should stay in their PE kit for the whole day, no change of clothes is necessary.
- **Swimming days:** Children should come to school wearing their PE Kit with their swimming kit in a small bag, there are cubicles and changing areas for the children to use.

Y4 - Y11

- **PE days:** students should arrive at school wearing their PE kit. They must bring a school uniform to change into after their PE lesson (unless their lesson is at the end of the day). Deodorant is acceptable, however, no glass containers are allowed and aerosol sprays are not permitted.
- **PE ECAs:** On a day when a student has a PE ECA after school but not a PE lesson, they must come to school in school uniform and change into PE kit, after school, in preparation for their activity.
- **PE & PE ECAs on the same day:**
 - Primary School: On a day where a student has PE and a PE ECA in the primary school, the student will still be required to change after the PE lesson, however they can change into a clean PE kit rather than school uniform.
 - Senior School: If a student has PE and a PE ECA on the same day, they must bring a school uniform to change into at the end of the lesson (unless the lesson is Period 5, in which case, students can go onto their ECA or go home).

Please take note of the following:

Clothing

- Clearly label all belongings with your child's name, including hats and bags.
- Skirts, skorts and shorts should be knee length.
- Trousers should be navy blue and formal in style. Please [see our BSM trouser guide here](#).
- Leggings should not be worn beneath skirts, skorts or shorts - trousers should be worn instead. Exception is for PE, when they can be worn under PE shorts.

- During any fancy dress days, clothes should be culturally appropriate. No hair dye or excessive make up on these days.
- Any student returning to BSM as a visitor, should also be wearing culturally appropriate clothing.

Shoes

- Footwear should be completely black with no heel, no open toe or open back.
- Any logo or sole should be completely black.
- Footwear should be a shoe or trainer and not a boot.

Hair

- **Primary** - Hair must be tidy and long hair tied back at all times.
- **Senior** - Hair must be tidy and long hair tied back for practical subjects such as PE, Science practical, DT and Art.
- Hair styles and colour should be smart, professional and not extreme.
- Hair styles and hair colour should not be a distraction to learning.
- All hair accessories should be modest and not distract from learning.
- Blue, black or white headscarves can be worn by girls.

Jewellery

- **Primary** - Jewellery permitted - 1 watch, 1 pair of stud earrings
- **Senior** - Jewellery permitted - 1 watch, 1 necklace (small and discreet), 1 pair of stud earrings, 1 signet ring
- Facial piercings are not allowed
- Religious jewellery and adornments - any family wishing a child to wear such items should submit a written request to the Pastoral Deputy Head of Primary School or Senior School, through the Primary or Senior School Office in advance of the item being worn. This request will then be reviewed and a written response will be given to the family regarding the School's decision.
- **PE for Primary** - if your child is unable to remove their own earrings from their ear lobe, then they must come to school with plasters over their earrings. We are unable to provide them from the Health Centre.
- **PE for Senior** - all jewellery needs to be removed

Make Up

- **Primary** - no make up to be worn
- **Senior** - Make-up, if worn, should be subtle, minimalistic and natural.
- Nail varnish is not permitted

Sun

- Sun Cream - we recommend that students wear sun cream for outside PE lessons and break times.
- Hats - We have a 'no-hat no-play' rule when students are outside for PE lessons and break times in the Primary School. Senior School students are encouraged to wear hats but it is not mandatory.
- Water Bottles - All students should bring a full water bottle to school with them every day.

Old Uniform

Grey trousers for boys in the Senior School are being phased out gradually over the next few years. If you purchase new trousers, please ensure they are navy blue, in line with our uniform above.
